Dear Resident of Freedom:

We are writing to thank those of you who voted to repeal the Town Commercial Development Ordinance on June 12th. As you know, this vote allows us to move forward with the Beaver Ridge Wind Project. We very much appreciate your vote of confidence and reiterate our commitment to develop our project as reviewed and approved by the Town's Planning Board.

As we promised in our last letter to you, we have directed our attorney to withdraw our appeal of the Town's Board of Appeal decision. The Town has "spoken" through yesterday's referendum – we are all better served when decisions such as these are made by our towns and not by our courts.

We would expect that the opponents of the Beaver Ridge project will also withdraw their own appeal and hope that they will honor the expressed will of the people of Freedom and not seek to frustrate further our ability to develop this very beneficial green energy project that brings important tax benefits, environmental benefits and energy security benefits to Freedom.

We understand that the Beaver Ridge Wind project is a major project for Freedom and that you have a strong interest in following our progress and staying abreast of our efforts.
