Dear Resident of Freedom:

We are writing to bring you up-to-date on our wind turbine project proposed for Beaver Ridge. As you are probably aware, the Town Board of Appeals reversed the decision of the Town's Planning Board to issue us a building permit to develop 3 wind turbines on Beaver Ridge. We have not given up on the Beaver Ridge wind project; however, we will need your support to make it happen.

We have been advised that a number of concerned citizens in Freedom have gathered signatures for a petition to repeal the recently adopted Commercial Development Review Ordinances. This issue will be put to referendum on June 12th to be voted on by the citizens of Freedom. If the Town of Freedom votes to repeal the recently adopted Ordinances, CES will respond by applying for a building permit for the same project that was previously approved by the Planning Board. CES commits to build the same wind project that the Planning Board reviewed for many months and subsequently approved. We will begin construction in the Spring of 2008, with the intent of having the project fully commissioned and operating by the end of 2008.

We have tried over the past year to be forthright and direct in all of our dealings with the Town. We have repeatedly said that we would develop our project only if it was supported by the residents of Freedom, and this remains true today. There have already been two referenda held in the Town, and each time you have shown your approval of our wind project by wide margins. CES is thankful for this support.

We continue to believe that our project is good for Freedom and remain very excited about the prospect of a small "community sized" wind project in Freedom that could be a model for other Maine towns. Our project ensures that a valuable piece of land remains in farming rather than be converted to a residential subdivision; it provides an important addition to the Town's tax base, while not imposing any additional service demands on the Town; it generates electricity without producing any toxic pollutants or contributing to global warming; and it helps incrementally in moving our country away from its disastrous dependence on Middle East oil.

However, what we believe is good for Freedom is, quite frankly, less important than what you believe is good for your Town. This has been and continues to be our guiding principle, and it is why we are asking you to turn out and vote one more time on our project on June 12. Of

course, we hope that you will agree with us and vote to support the development of the Beaver Ridge Wind project. But if you do not, we will respect your vote.

We are very appreciative of the time and effort that the Planning Board, the Board of Appeals, and many residents have devoted to the review and consideration of our project. Each Board showed us every courtesy and conducted themselves and the process with great integrity. We thank them for their efforts and for their willingness to serve the Town.

We are a small Maine company with strong local ties. We believe that our long term interests are best served by a project that will meet with the approval of Freedom residents both before and after it is constructed.
