We are writing to introduce ourselves and to start a dialog about the potential for wind power in Dixmont. We are the principals in Beaver Ridge Wind, the company established to develop 3 wind turbines on Beaver Ridge in nearby Freedom, Maine. We have a strong interest in developing community sized wind projects. A community sized wind project uses small installations of large utility scale wind turbines to economically produce renewable energy. Our focus on small installations also allows us to utilize sites that have good wind resources but which are too small for the mega-projects that are standard practice in the U.S. today.

As you maybe aware, the Town of Freedom granted CES the first permit issued in Maine for a project of this type and only the second wind permit ever granted in the State. Beaver Ridge Wind is on schedule to have this 3 turbine project online by the end of 2008. The residents of Freedom supported this project for many reasons, including (i) concerns about global warming and the effects of mercury, sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides that are produced by fossil fuel based power generation, (ii) the need to reduce our dependence on foreign sources of energy for economic and national security reasons, (iii) the tax benefits that will accrue to the town and (iv) the fact that wind projects impose no additional burdens on the Town's public services

We have been working closely with several landowners in Dixmont to explore the potential for a project on Mt. Harris similar to the one we are building in Freedom. On December 1st we erected a 60 meter anemometer on Mt. Harris on land that we have under long term lease with the owner. The anemometer is a temporary device that collects detailed wind speed and direction data. We will need to collect wind data for a minimum of 1 year before we can confirm the suitability of the site, but we feel that it is appropriate to start a dialog with Town officials and residents as early as possible.


